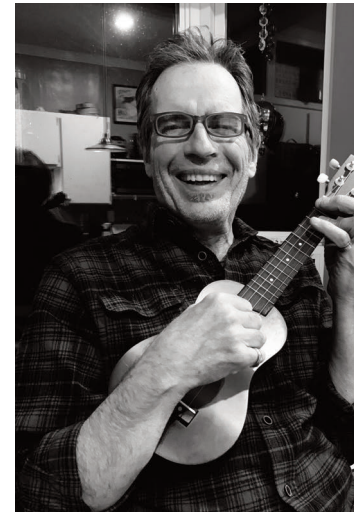

Pre-Concert Ukelele Workshop!

You know that ukulele you hung on the wall a couple of years ago? Take it down, dust it off and bring it to our FREE workshop and learn how to play this cool instrument. Bill Stoye will be conducting this clinic and he promises to show you four chords that killed rock n' roll! He will print out three or four songs that the class can learn and play along with. He will also go over some strumming patterns. Standard tuning-GCEA is what you will be learning from. Tips are greatly appreciated.

December, the time to bundle up, wax those skis, shake the tangles out of those holiday lights and sip a hot cup of spiced cider. If your holiday list includes any of these, you are probably in dire need of some hot picking and that's exactly what you are going to get from the IAMA Local Concert on December 6th when champion fingerpicker **Matt Seabury** (with friends), and **Michelle Moonshine's Trio** hit the South Valley Unitarian stage at 6876 South Highland Dr. IAMA members need only \$7 to enter. The show starts at 7:30 but be there early for a great seat, and for our pre-concert ukulele workshop event.

Matthew Seabury is a Native Utah musician growing up with a magnificent view of the Wasatch Front "mount-uns". His introduction to the guitar came via his brother Rex (*Utah Slim*) at a ranch in Southern Utah at age 11. Returning home to SLC, he received his first guitar, a Yamaha nylon string followed closely by a 1968 Martin D18 that his "Nona" gave him (which he still has and cherishes!). His musical passion is fingerstyle guitar (he won the 2014 *Utah State Fin-*

gerstyle Championship competition!). That passion was fueled again by his brother Rex who came up with a unique tuning that he has adopted and has been a major influence on the guitar instrumentals he has written. One mostly original piece has as its main theme a piece that Rex wrote in the early 1970's (the main reason he plays guitar today). Twenty years later, he gave that beautiful theme an intro, a second part and an outro. Called "*Dry-Wash Walking*", it is a piece that embodies Matt's experience in the red rock deserts. He will be joined on stage with a few friends that will serve to make his original compositions and interpretations of known pieces come to life. A good time is sure to be had by all!

Michelle Moonshine's Trio will include **Andrew Wiscombe** on guitar and harmonica, **Bronk Onion** on bass, and of course **Michelle Moonshine** herself on vocals and guitar.

Cutting her teeth by sneaking into venues and clubs to perform starting at eighteen years old, Michelle has spent the last seven years developing her own blend of Americana music. Pulling from such influences as Gram Parsons, Doc

Watson and Bob Dylan, you can hear tastes of Folk, Classic Country, Bluegrass and American Roots music. With frequent comparisons to Alison Krauss or a young Emmylou Harris, Michelle delivers a performance that feels both raw yet refined.

With upbeat tempos, catchy vocal lines and heartfelt lyrics; it's still her unique voice that truly engages a listener at a performance. Her timbre can be described as incredibly sweet and whimsical, yet saturated with feeling that draws you in to listening for every word. Declining her recruitment from *NBC's The Voice*, she traded bright lights for hard work and a chance to serve the song with a group of seasoned musicians who both compliment and contribute to her sound.

Michelle and company are currently finishing up their upcoming album and continue to showcase their music regionally with lush harmony and ample twang.
