October LCS

The Oct. 4th concert kicks off IAMA LCS season with **Columbia Jones** and **The Proper Way**.

Columbia Jones has spent the better part of the last three years traveling the country as a blues-fueled one-man band - a path that has helped him to develop the dynamic range of country, rock and folk influences showcased in his first full-length studio album, *I'm a Terrible Human Being*.

While musically the album blends genres throughout, lyrically many of the tracks serve to support the thesis statement presented by the album's title. Columbia relates the particulars of making a living as a full-time traveling musician against the contrasting backdrop of "grownup" expectations and the accompanying "real world" measurements of success as either a tongue-in-cheek expression, or a pious confession.

However, *I'm a Terrible Human Being* is more than an existential exercise for Columbia Jones. In addition to the writing and performing, Jones also engineered, produced, and mixed most of the album on his own. It's a level of involvement that gives the record a personal touch and convinces us that Columbia isn't all that terrible after all.

The Proper Way formed in 2016 when multi-instrumentalist singersongwriters Scott Rogers (vocals, guitar, banjo, mandolin) and Shane Osguthorpe (vocals, piano, guitar) met while performing at a music festival in Ogden, UT. The duo quickly hit the road, with its first performances as The Proper Way taking place on a week-long run in the Lake Tahoe area. Since

They released a CD in 2016, and two EPs of original music are coming in 2019.

In 2017, The Proper Way approached Ogden singer-songwriter **Carrie Myers** (vocals, ukulele) to collaborate on a studio project. *Ain't No Good Thing Ever Dies*, a collection of obscure songs by Tom Waits and Bob Dylan, was released in October, 2018. During the recording process, the trio enlisted the help of Ogden-based guitarist and lap-steel wizard **Ryan Hawthorn** (vocals, guitar).

The result of this alliance is a new project, **Carrie Myers + The Proper Way**, and this three-piece (and often four- or five-piece) is busy writing songs and performing for crowds all over the region.






