

For those newcomer acoustic music aficionados who have never been to one of our Local Concerts, here's the deal. We select the very best intermountain acoustic musicians to play in a warm inviting venue to an appreciative crowd who are actually there to hear the music. The sound is great, thanks to our stellar sound crew, led by Danny Malland, and if you get there a bit earlier than the 7:30 start time you can mingle with one of the finest groups of people you can imagine.

Oh, and it is a real deal with \$7.00 admission for members and \$12.00 for non-members. If you are a long-time fan of the LCS bring someone who hasn't been there and introduce them to new friends and great acts and encourage them to become members of IAMA.

Cosy Sheridan



Songwriter and guitarist Cosy Sheridan has been called "one of the era's finest and most thoughtful songwriters." Her songs are carefully crafted. "Cosy writes intelligent and clever lyrics with stickable melodies," wrote Sing Out Magazine - which listed Sheridan's CD Pretty Bird release among their Great CDs of 2014. Sheridan's performances are full of energy and emotionality. Backed by the strong rhythms and harmonies of her bass player Charlie *Koch*, she plays a percussive bluesy guitar style - often in open tunings and occasionally with 2 or more capos on the guitar. Her concerts are a wide-ranging exploration: love songs for a complicated world, and sprinkled in and about her signature parodies on aging and women.

In 1992, she won both the *Kerrville Folk Festival* and the *Telluride Blue-grass Festival* songwriting contests. She's been on the road ever since. "You can't make it into double digits, and continue touring for twenty or so years, unless you know what you're doing, and do it well," wrote *The Chicago Examiner*. "Rarely do you find a CD where every song is memorable. It happens, just not often. It happens here."

For the past 20 years she has taught classes in songwriting, performance and guitar at workshops and adult music camps across the country. She is the director and founder of *Moab Folk*

Camp in Moab, Utah.

Mountain Country is a hard-working Utah band formed around the award-winning songwriting and pas-

sions of *Jim Fish*. The band Mountain Country enters your heart with spirited Americana acoustic music, with roots that plow deep into Bluegrass and Country genres. Their shows are filled with tunes you fondly remember, as well as contagious original music that keeps your toes tapping and your soul happy!

Formed in 2013 the band has had a few moving parts change, but the music has remained consistent.

Their acoustic songs are very dynamic. Both the instruments and the musicians get a solid workout! Key players of the Mountain Country sound are *Jim Fish* (Guitar), *Thor Rasmussen* (Dobro), *Karma Rasmussen* (Bass), *Ryan Whalen* (Banjo) and *Shawn Foster* (Fiddle/Mandolin).

Mountain Country released their first album of original music in 2017 entitled Mountain Country "Home Grown". Many of these songs are now part of their requested songs during performances and have been accepted into the music catalog of their fans. Past performances include the Utah Arts Festival, the Evanston Bluegrass Festival, Wasatch Mountain Music Festival, Gallivan Center Bluegrass Saturday Night, and the Dejoria Performance Center.




