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

MAY LOCAL CONCERT SERIES SEASON FINALE! Fiddlers 3! & Rail Jumpers 7:30 PM Friday, May 3rd, 2019 by Steve Lutz

Drum roll please! The 2018-2019
Local Concert Series season concludes
on Friday, May 3rd, with two iconic
Utah bands. Three of the best fiddlers
anywhere come together as a band
mysteriously called Fiddlers 3!. They
will be joined by bluegrass stars, The
Rail Jumpers. The show at the South
Valley Unitarian Society hits the tracks
at 7:30 pm, marking the end of a very
successful and fun-filled concert season.

\$7 and a brief drive to 6876 South Highland Dr. brings a great night of music and a chance to meet old friends and new. As of press time, we are finagling the final schedule for next year's series and we'll give you some announcements about that at the show, as well. So as we sign off for the season, y'all have a wonderful summer and be sure to get outside to hear some more great acoustic music. Many thanks to the entire IAMA Local Concert Committee, and a special shout out for ace sound engineer Danny Maland!

Fiddlers 3! is a trio of violinist/fiddlers who share a fascination with the violin and the music that it can make. They share this fascination in concert by performing their arrangements of classical pieces, traditional fiddle tunes, and original or traditional songs.

The group consists of **Kate MacLeod**, **Bronwen Beecher**, and **Mary Danzig**. All professional performing musicians, they have been contributing to the Utah music community for many years.

Kate MacLeod is originally from the Washington DC area, but has lived in Utah since she moved to Salt Lake

City to study violin making. Her original music has been recorded and performed by other artists across the country and into Europe. She tours internationally, is a studio musician, and is vocalist and fiddler for other touring artists. Kate has several recordings and books that feature her songs and violin instrumental pieces. Bronwen Beecher has gathered music and performance experience from a varied background that includes studying at the University of New Orleans, working as a street performer, and learning many styles of world music through her travels from Nova Scotia to China. She is founder and CEO of the Fiddle Preacher Music Teaching Studio.

Mary Danzig is half of the nationally recognized folk/newgrass duo Otter Creek, where she is fiddler and vocalist. She is a *Utah State Fiddle Champion* who regularly trades her boots and jeans for concert black to perform as a member of the violin section in *Sinfonia Salt Lake*. Mary currently teaches violin and fiddle privately, and at the Salt Lake Community College.

The Rail Jumpers play traditional and original bluegrass music along with folk songs from the past.

Playing rhythm guitar and singing most of the lead songs is Terry Rose, originally from West Virginia. He was inspired to play bluegrass as a young man when he attended many festivals with groups such as the original *Seldom Scene*, *Country Gentlemen*, and *Osborne Brothers*. Terry was also influenced by many other musicians from the 70s and 80s. Being from WV, he has a deep love for bluegrass music.

Larry Swift plays mandolin and adds vocals. Raised in the Ozarks of Missouri, he has since been a SLC fixture in many bluegrass bands for many years. Larry has a very unique style with a great baritone voice to fill in

the harmonies.

Their newest and youngest group member is fiddle player, **Anastasia Lund**. She was the open fiddle champion at the *Utah State Instrument Championships* in 2016. Anastasia has been playing fiddle with Rail Jumpers for several years and does a great job filling in the spaces for this ensemble. She keeps herself busy in other groups as well.

On bass is **Janna Lauer**. Janna has been playing bass for many years in SLC and in other regional music shows. Her superb playing keeps this group planted firmly on the ground, making Rail Jumpers a true band instead of a jam session. Janna is also the founder and Executive Director of the local non-profit *Heart & Soul*, which provides music to various isolated populations.

Mark Anger is on 5-string banjo and adds another voice. He has been playing for some 50 years, and has been with local well-known bands such as the Mountain Dogs, Rick Martinez Band, Bluegrass Conspiracy, Buyin' Time, and Good Grass. While his skill is obvious, it's also clear that Mark is always having fun, which is why he is a true fit for the Rail Jumpers!

12th Annual Songwriter Academy June 20-22! With Christine Lavin and Kate MacLeod

The 12th annual *IAMA Songwriter Academy*, co-hosted with the **Utah Arts Festival**, is excited to bring from New York City...**Christine Lavin**!

Christine is a singer songwriter, guitarist, performer, and recording artist. She has released her 23rd solo album, SPAGHETTIFICATION, which was #5 for the month of September on the International FolkDJ chart. Christine performs concerts all over the US, Canada, and points beyond (Australia, Germany, Israel). Songs of hers have been performed by artists as diverse as Broadway stars Betty Buckley, Sutton Foster, and David Burnham, cabaret divas Andrea Marcovicci. Barbara Brussell, and Colleen McHugh, the college a cappella Dartmouth Decibelles, and The Accidentals. She also writes freelance for publications including The Washington Post, Huffington Post, The St. Petersburg Times, The Performing Songwriter, and Delta "Sky" Magazine. In November 2011 her book COLD PIZZA FOR BREAKFAST: A MEM-WHA?? won the 43rd Annual ASCAP Deems Taylor Award for excellence in nonfiction writing about pop music. Christine has also won five ASCAP composer awards, the Backstage Bistro Award for Best NYC Singer/Songwriter Of The Year, The Kate Wolf Memorial Award, and her album *Good Thing He Can't* Read My Mind won Album Of The Year from the National Association Of Independent Record Distributors. She collaborates with many

other songwriters and performers and has been an integral part of contemporary songwriting. She is humorous, some would say hilarious, and loves to share her craft with others.

Each year, the academy brings in a new guest instructor to co-teach with Utah's **Kate MacLeod**.

Kate is a musician and songwriter who performs across the country and into Europe. Her songs have been performed and recorded by various artists from California to the Czech Republic in many roots music genres. Working with a different guest instructor creates a new experience every year for the IAMA Songwriter Academy. There will be discussions of the nuts and bolts of songwriting, a performance workshop, a class on creating a music video with your iPhone, and song sharing/critique sessions.

The series of events begins with a meet and greet event on Thursday,

June 20th, 7pm, at *Ken Sanders Rare Books*. Classes are scheduled from 9am-6pm on June 21st at the Salt Lake City Public Library. Song critiquing/sharing will continue on Sat 22nd with Kate MacLeod.

Registration opens at 7:00 AM on Saturday and Sunday mornings. Contests begin at 8am. Banjo, mandolin, and fingerstyle guitar competitions will be held on Saturday, while flatpick guitar and fiddle will be held on Sunday. Last year's fundraiser breakfast was a wonderful success so we're bringing it back. You can enjoy a hot breakfast on both mornings. All proceeds go toward running the contests. The registration, contests, and breakfast all take place at the Bowery Stage inside the park.



Your requests have been heard and a novice fingerstyle category has been added this year! That means there will be a novice and open division for each instrument category. It is completely up to the competitor to decide which division to enter. The only exception is if you have previously won first place in a novice division, then you must level-up and play in the open competition. First place winners of open divisions will receive an automatic entry into the National Competitions in Winfield, Kansas in September 2019. They will also receive an instrument!


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THE BIBLE

has been around for a long time, but relatively few people know what's actually in it, because they (meaning you) haven't had the time or inclination to read it. By hearsay they know about Adam & Eve, Noah's Ark, Jonah's whale, and similar bits. But there's a whole lot more interesting stuff in it which is worth knowing, since it is and has been an influential book in Western culture.

A PHILOSOPHER LOOKS AT THE BIBLE is a two-volume work meant to help fill in that void. Two reasons why the Bible is seldom read are its archaic language, and a certain sense of preachiness that is off-putting. This work avoids both of those problems. It lays out the whole works in an easy style that is both entertaining and informative. It's purpose isn't to criticize or "refute" the Bible, but to make its stories more accessible...with occasional critical remarks in passing.



The Old Testament volume tells, among other things, what happened to Cain after he killed his brother, what Ham did to piss off his father Noah, the improbably tale of Samson and the foxes, whether King David was really a clueless dweeb, and the real story of Job's suffering. You'll learn about Moses and the Golden Calf, about the siege of Jericho and the parting of the waters of the river Jordan. You'll find out who Nebuchadnezzar was and what he did, and why he did it, Ezekiel's adventure with the dry bones, Jeremiah's constant scolding and more. You'll find maps and explanations of the various places mentioned.

In the New Testament volume you'll learn things you didn't realize about the 3 kings' visit to the child Jesus. You'll see the different Gospel accounts of what Jesus did and why he did them. You'll find proposed alternative analyses of the Son of God claim. You'll learn how really important John the Baptist was, the different accounts of the death and entombment of Jesus, the various things that happened after his death; and most importantly, how Paul invented Christianity. And of course, you'll learn the chilling details of the end of times in the Book of Revelation.

Coming to the Utah Arts Festival Tinsley Ellis Saturday, June 22, 9:45pm Festival Stage

Tinsley Ellis (born June 4, 1957) is an American blues and rock musician, who was born in Atlanta, Georgia, and grew up in South Florida. According to Billboard, "nobody has released more consistently excellent blues albums than Atlanta's Tinsley Ellis. He sings like a man possessed and wields a mean lead guitar."

His love for electric blues grew by listening to British Invasion bands such as the Yardbirds, the Animals, Cream, and the Rolling Stones. Inspired by a live appearance by B.B. King, he was determined to become a blues guitarist. In 1975, he played with the Haygood Band while attending Emory University near Atlanta. Two years later, already an accomplished musician, he returned to Atlanta and joined his first professional blues band, the Alley Cats, a group that included Preston Hubbard of the Fabulous Thunderbirds. In 1981. he formed the Heartfixers, with the singer and harmonica player Chicago Bob Nelson. The group recorded three albums for the small Landslide record label. The same year, Ellis signed a recording

contract with Chicago's **Alligator Records**.

Records.
His debut solo
album on Alligator
Records, *Georgia*Blue, was released in
1988. Alligator then
reissued two of his
earlier CDs, Cool On
It and Tore Up (featuring Nappy
Brown).

Ellis' reputation and media coverage continued to grow. He appeared on NBC-TV Sports during the network's 1996 Summer Olympics coverage.

Ellis shifted to Capricorn Records in 2000 and released *Kingpin*. In 2002 he joined Telarc Records, producing two CDs: *Hell or High Water* and *The Hard Way*. All the while Ellis never stopped touring. "A musician never got famous by staying home," Ellis says. He claims to have performed live, at least once, in all 50 of the United States.

He returned to **Alligator Records** in 2005 with the live album, *Live!* Highwayman. In 2007 he released the studio album, *Moment of Truth,* followed in 2009 with *Speak No Evil.* Ellis continues to tour over 150 nights a year around the world.

In early 2013, Ellis was a part of the 'Blues at the Crossroads 2' tour which celebrated the music of Muddy Waters and Howlin' Wolf.

In 2013, Ellis launched his own label, **Heartfixer Music**, and has since released several albums: the all instrumental *Get It!*, *Midnight Blue*, *Tough Love* and in 2016, *Red Clay Soul*.

IIn 2017, Ellis launched a new side project called *Tinsley Ellis Blues Is Dead*, in which he performs the blues and R&B songs recorded by Grateful Dead and other Fillmore era acts.




