Susan Bush and Phil Triolo have been playing music together, both informally around campfires and "flash jams" and at formal gigs since 2015. Susan composes and sings her own songs, tasteful musical compositions with piercing and provocative experience-inspired lyrics. She accompanies herself on guitar or ukulele, while Phil improvises backup melodies on clarinets. The result is an interesting and unique blend of smooth indie folk with a jazzy blues twist. Susan is a Utah native who has been singing since childhood and started playing the guitar after moving into the University of Utah neighborhood to attend college. It was there she was delighted and inspired by the frequent neighborhood backyard jam sessions. Susan started writing and singing her own songs while attending graduate school and has since released two albums of original compositions: Time Wandering (2017) and Firelight (2019). Phil began playing clarinet at the age of 10 and saxophone at the age of 12. After moving to Utah, he joined the Disgusting Brothers Band and has played tenor sax in the "heritage rock" band since the early 80's. Phil has accompanied Susan since 2015, and he plays backup clarinet on most of the cuts of her first album. Phil currently plays saxes or clarinets in several other local bands including the Dusty Boxcar Sextet, the Smoking Blues Band, Silver Tongue Devils, and in other duo and trio projects with Bruce Christensen and Craig Shriber, respectively. Susan and Phil have twice played at the Utah Arts Festival, and along

with Rex Flinner, previously were

selected to play an IAMA concert in 2016.

The Backyard Revival is a Folk/Americana group with male/female duet-style lead vocals with occasional 3- and 4-part harmonies, supported by guitar, fiddle/mandolin, ukulele, and upright bass. They present an eclectic live show abundant with toe-tapping originals and creatively interpreted covers. They are just 4 singer/songwriters collaborating in the most intimate, personal way they know how. The band is the brainchild of Brian Bingham. As a Utah native born in Sandy, he is a veteran of the local scene, having played in bands for over 20 years. He spent those decades searching for the perfect combination of musicians and has finally found it in Sarah, Kya, and Juliette. Brian is obsessed with learning new fretted string instruments, and regularly performs on guitar, banjo, tenor guitar, and octave mandolin. He's not trying to change the world with his songs, but since music saved his life, it's now his life mission to give back as much as he can.

Sarah Little Drum, is an American singer, songwriter, and multi-instrumentalist from the hills of Northeastern Pennsylvania. Currently living in Salt Lake City, she sings lead and plays ukulele. Sarah also performs solo and is a founding member of Year of the Dog where she also plays accordion. Stylistically, she is best known for her impressive vocal range. Acoustic textures and poetic lyrics blend with her surreal and seductive inflections to create a unique sound sometimes called "Dream Torch". She is no doubt the spiritual leader of the band.

**Kya Karine** fell in love with playing music at a very young age. She started by studying voice and playing violin but when she picked up her first bass as a teenager, something resonated deeply. In 2017 Kya graduated from the University of Utah with a Bachelor's degree in Jazz Performance. She works fulltime as a freelance musician on both upright and electric bass. Kya teaches private bass students and works as a substitute band and orchestra teacher. She is the full-time bassist for several other groups including Lonesome Folk, and Uptown Sound. Kya has several of her own bands, including a 10-piece Amy Winehouse Tribute Band and a Jazz group in her name playing both beloved jazz standards and popular songs from today and even a few original songs.

Juliette "Jypsyette" Camille was born in Apple Valley, CA and has played violin since before she could talk. While she is the youngest member of the band, she is arguably also the most experienced. Juliette is the perfect lead player for many different styles and has performed with Roy Clark, Rhonda Vincent, and the Gatlin Brothers as well as local favorites Sammy Brue and Pixie and the Partygrass Boys.

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#### IN MEMORIUM: Joe McQueen May 30, 1919 - Dec. 7, 20219

On Saturday, Dec. 7, legendary Jazz saxophonist Joe McQueen passed away, at the age of 100, after receiving treatment for intestinal cancer. McQueen was not only a prolific musician, but an actively religious man involved in many different parts of the spiritual community throughout the state. He




had been busy playing music for most of the seven dacades he resided in Utah. He arrived in Utah with his wife on Dec. 7,

1945 and never left, until he departed this world exactly 74 years later. He is survived, not just by his wife Thelma McQueen, but by a whole community of Jazz enthusiasts and friends, members of his band and those he's taken under his generous and wise wing over the years, which includes longtime local radio host and station director at KUAA Bad Brad Wheeler.

He leaves behind a legacy not just as Utah's bona fide best Jazz musician—one who played with the likes of Charlie Parker, Chet Baker and Duke Ellington when they rolled through town on the railroad in the heyday of Jazz music—but also as the reason that Northern Utah clubs finally desegregated. As white club owners reached out to McQueen, trying to get the talented man to play, he only agreed to do it if they'd let in other black Utahns to watch him right alongside the white audience. They understandably gave in. In more recent years he was a monthly staple at The Garage on Beck Street.

The man lived to be 100, and graced the people of this state with his music for most of his life and residence here. He gave more than enough of his music to us, and the fact that he had a lineup of upcoming shows just demonstrates how much he was willing to keep on giving.

Here's to a truly great man.

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


