

Of course, as always South Valley Unitarian Universalist Society stage at 6876 South Highland Dr. is the venue. IAMA members pay only \$7 to enter. The show starts at 7:30 but be there early for a great seat and for our pre-concert event.

Long time friends and IAMA members, Anke Summerhill, accompanied by Special Guests Kate
MacLeod on fiddle & vocals and
Matthew Seabury on bass & vocals, will play some of Anke's original music, along with a few of her favorite songs written by other songwriters. They look forward to an evening of making "humansized music for humans".

Anke Summerhill has lived in Salt Lake City so long, that one could almost "pencil her in as a Utah Native." Her journey from Canada via Germany and a short but meaningful stay in England during her early school years, brought her to Utah in the mid 1980's. Anke's love of the beautiful desert, the mystery of wild open spaces, and great community continue to hold her here and inspire the music she makes.

To date, Anke has recorded two full-length CDs of moving compositions, replete with deep, thoughtful and original lyrics. While performing at a festival in California, musician David Lindley once told her: "you have a voice like a cello".

She loves to sing, and along with singing her own songs, she often has the pleasure of accompanying friends in live performances, on their CD recordings as well as making music with some of her favorite non-profit organizations like Heart & Soul and The Moab Folk Camp.

Kate MacLeod is a musician of many colors. With experience in Celtic, Bluegrass, and various ethnic styles of fiddle playing, as well as a foundation in



Classical music, she enjoys adding her soulful playing to any music configuration.

As a fiddle player and singer, she's often found accompanying musicians in Utah when she's not on tour performing her own music. Kate and Anke are long-time friends who have occasionally worked together in music over the years.

Matthew Seabury is a Native Utah



musician, growing up with a magnificent view of the Wasatch Front mountains. His musical passion is fingerstyle guitar, for which he won the 2014 Utah State Fingerstyle Championship showcase. Also a highly sought-after bass guitar player, he can often be seen rocking his bass as a member of The Lazlos and SALT, two busy Salt Lake City-based bands.

The Culprit is a Folk/Americana group that is rooted heavily in fingerstyle guitar a la Jerry Reed, Chet Atkins and Tommy Emmanuel. With a stellar band that includes guitars, mandolin, banjo, bass, accordion and vocals, they have fun entertaining audiences with their arrangements of songs from country blues to contemporary guitar masters and more.

Austin Weyand formed the group after years of playing a mix of guitar styles in a variety of settings including classical, jazz, flamenco, celtic, folk, bluegrass, etc. He was excited to devote a specific project to the great music of Jerry Reed, Tommy Emmanuel, etc. Austin has been the champion of the state of Wyoming Fingerstyle guitar competition 3 times, most recently in 2018. He also holds the same title in Utah from 2012. He has two solo guitar albums, *Too Much Information* and *They Call Me Dad*.

Kelin Gibbons plays mandolin/ banjo, Kassie Weyand performs on accordion and vocals, and Mike Reeder on clarinet and saxophone.






