## March 2020 LCS by Steve Lutz

Do you love March as much as I do? I specifically remember many March 6ths, mostly because that's my daughter's birthday, which has always involved a lot of fun. This March 6th, you can make some fun memories yourself at the IAMA Local Concert on the South Valley Unitarian Universalist stage at 6876 South Highland Dr. IAMA members need only \$7 to enter. For that tiny price you'll get to experience Tiny Home and Ophir Creek. The show starts at 7:30 but be there early for a great seat and for our pre-concert event.

March is also the month that the Local Concert Committee gets together and evaluates all of the applicants for next year's series. It's always difficult to pick the very best acts based on a small sample of performers' works. We know that we can't make everyone happy but we genuinely strive to make you, the listeners, happy. That's our main mission and one that we take very seriously!

Based in Salt Lake City, Utah, Tiny Home is Sonya Cotton and Gabe Dominguez. Sonya and Gabe have been singing together nearly since the day they met, in August 2007. Their repertoire spans a wide variety of genres, including original and traditional folk songs, musical theater classics, jazz standards, and composers from Tom Waits to Townes Van Zandt. They have recorded two albums: a self-titled collection of ballads. and a Christmas album entitled "Christmas Carols for Our Mothers". Both Gabe and Sonya are driven, personally and musically, by a

deep love for wild places and creatures. They have completed three different week-long music/walking tours up the California coast, performing tiny concerts in small towns along the way, and carrying their guitar on their backs. Their future vision includes a train tour of the Pacific Northwest and a tour by canoe down the Delaware River.

In addition to Tiny Home, Sonya and Gabe each have their own personal music projects. Sonya composes and records lush folk songs, and has released four albums of original music which can be heard

on her website. Gabe has created his own musical style called "Whup", which is a rock & roll hybridization of: Afro-Latin and Caribbean rhythms, bluegrass fiddling,

gospel choir, marching band percussion, and ecotopian perspectives. In other words, it's social/eco justice music that you can dance to! He goes by SHAKE YOUR PEACE! and his latest record "Whup Music" was released in late 2019, and can be heard on his website.

Ophir Creek is a Utah group working to redefine the folk, bluegrass and southern gospel tradition, and to keep it burning with an exciting new sound: "Folkgrass Americana". The members have performed variously at Olympic venues, county fairs, Utah city celebrations, and numerous commu-

nity and church functions throughout northern Utah; 60's coffee houses in Pennsylvania and Maryland, night clubs in Hong Kong, Jamaica and Florida; and Bluegrass gigs in Tennessee and Idaho. Collectively they have over 250 years of performance experience. The band performs a range of songs from soft ballads that tug at the heart to rollicking banjo supported slices of Americana. Members, from the northern Utah area, and all providing vocals, are Dave Shurtleff, guitar 6 & 12 string; Dale Searcy, guitar, resonator and baritone; John Sargent, guitar, mandolin, banjo; Keith Ray, bass; Don "Ban Jovi" Messenger, hot bluegrass banjo, and Ken Bradshaw, guitar and banjo.




